***Graduate Studies in Music***

***Overview:***

The graduate program in music is designed to provide specialized, professional education experiences for music students. The program is large enough to provide a wide variety of high quality music experiences, yet small enough to accommodate individual student interests and needs. Graduate music students are able to select from traditional resident courses and/or summer study experiences and may combine traditional course delivery and distance learning options.

***Graduate Music Students:***

All graduate music students are given opportunities to develop:

- General knowledge of music
- Techniques for evaluating current research/ideas in music with a focus on personal application
- The ability to express ideas effectively through communication (oral and written)

In addition, graduate music students may choose to develop personal competencies in music teaching, performance, applied study, assessment, pedagogy, elementary music, educating students with disabilities, improvisation, conducting, arranging, composing, repertoire, recording, audio production, music technology, and other musical skills. International study and interdisciplinary collaboration are encouraged.
